CERTIFIED FLOODPLAIN MANAGER (CFM) PROGRAM & EXAMINATION

The Association of State Floodplain Managers (ASFPM) has established the CFM as a national program for professional certification of floodplain managers. The CFM Program is directed toward individuals from widely varying occupations, interests, & educational backgrounds who have routine floodplain management duties. This includes community/state/federal officials, the private sector, academia, interest groups, & private citizens. The program promotes continuing education & professional development to enhance the knowledge & performance of local, state, federal, & private sector floodplain managers.

The CFM Exam measures a person's knowledge of a community's responsibilities under the National Flood Insurance Program & related floodplain management topics.
